## This Week at Hearsall

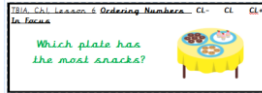

They have been writing numbers in the glitter tray and using paint! The children have also been looking at matching numeral to quantity using numicon tiles and different computer games. A big well done to all our Mathematicians this week for trying their best!



**Year 1 and 2** In maths this week the children have been comparing and ordering numbers, using resources to work out their answers. They have been learning new vocabulary such as greater than, greatest, smallest, least and most.



This week the children have been writing their own adventure stories in English and have been working on their addition skills in Maths. In Theme we have looked at gathering data on our favourite types of toys and putting this into a pictogram. We also enjoyed our dance session this week.
