Every child in the school made a poppy this week as part of learning about Remembrance and why we wear poppies. The children had an assembly to learn about the centenary of WWI. They learnt about how WWII affected Coventry so badly in 1940 and we tried to imagine how children's lives would have been affected. The poppies have been put on display in the reception area and make a beautiful display to commemorate Remembrance Day.

School attendance is still on the up and I am sending out postcards when we see improvements in behaviour and attendance. Whole school attendance is now at 96.6% and still above national. We want to get this up higher and would like to see it above 97% - let's keep trying!

Nursery and Reception Nursery have had an exciting week thinking about remembering others. We started by learning about poppies and Remembrance Day and finished the week remembering children who have less than we do for Children in Need Day. We had lots of fun making our texture poppies, for the school display, and talking about the different materials. We created glitter poppies in the tuff spot and used the Interactive whiteboard to draw poppies using the correct colours. On Friday we talked about Children in Need and why we raise money to help others. It was fun to dress up for the day!



Reception have been learning all about the book 'funny bones' this week. They have thoroughly enjoyed being doctors and nurses and helping Bob to remember the names of his bones!



Year 1 and 2 In Year 1 the children have been learning to name positions in a queue, using ordinal numbers. They were able to think about the position they



were in, who was before and after them, and find their position label. This week in English the children have started to write their own versions of Little Red Riding Hood, which they will get a chance to share with year 1 on Friday. In Maths in Year 2 the children have been working on dividing by 2, 5 and 10 and have been using counters to aid their understanding.
