The Green Cross Code

- Keep looking and listening for traffic as you cross.
- If you're not sure, don't cross.

Year 4 have been learning all about ska music and the impact that music has had on car industry. They have created explanation texts, written and then composed their own songs.

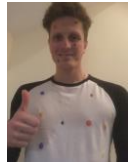
