Nursery and Reception

This week in Nursery we have been learning the story of 'The Little Red Hen'. We decided to create some 'hen hand print' pictures but in lots of different colours. The children loved exploring what



colours they could make with their partner by painting their hands with a chosen colour and then mixing hands together until a new colour was formed. They printed this colour onto their card to create their 'hen hand print'.



This week Reception have been learning about The Wolf's side of the story. They have enjoyed picking sides and debating who is telling the truth.



Year 1 and 2

This week in maths the children have been learning how to half and quarter shapes. They have tried really hard to work independently, showing their understanding. The tasks they completed involved cutting shapes into halves or quarters, and putting them back together to make a whole. We are now moving on to halving and quartering numbers!



In year 2 this week we have been practising all of our key maths skills. In English we continued with our text 'A new home for a pirate' and have been writing our own guides on how to be a pirate. In Theme this week, we had to solve the mystery of the missing ipad and discovered some interesting facts about the prime suspect Blackbeard the pirate.
