#### **Maths**

- ❖ Weather Division Problems. Answer the questions - Choose either 1\*, 2\*\* or 3\*\*\* difficulty rating.
- Make a tally or a pictogram showing the amount of rainfall over a week. How many hours did it rain for? Which day had the most rain?
- Find out the temperature outside for each day this week. What was the temperature on each day? Order the days from the hottest to the coldest.
- The average temperature in England in April is 12°C. What do you know about the number 12? Can you list 20 number facts with the answer of 12?

## **Creative**

- Music Create your own musical instrument, which makes weather sounds e.g. a rain stick using rice and a kitchen roll tube. Challenge-Create a soundscape of a storm using a variety of household objects.
- Design an outfit you would wear in each of the four seasons. Label the items you would need.
