## Maths

- ❖ At the White House in the USA, they have an egg rolling competition where they push decorated hard-boiled eggs along the floor with a wooden spoon. Have a go and then measure how far you can push the egg. You could measure it in feet or use a ruler or measuring tape.
- ❖ Easter egg/chocolate hunt. Hide Easter eggs and chocolates for your family to find around your house and in your garden. Give each egg a value (2 points, 5 points) and time 2 minutes to look for them. How many points did each person get? Can you beat their score?
- ❖ Can you make these delicious Rocky Road cakes? Use the recipe and make sure you measure your ingredients carefully.

- ❖ In Germany, they have Easter egg trees called Ostereierbaum. Try using paper mache or recycled goods to make and decorate a 3d egg to hang and decorate a tree. (see attached PDF for more information) 
- ❖ See if you can make an Easter basket to put your eggs in. Use the template provided to help you or use materials at home to make your own. (PDF resource)
- ❖ Research the birch twigs in Sweden. What are they? Why do they use birch twigs? When you have discovered what they are, see if you can make your very own birch twigs using materials at home. 



## Investigative

- ❖ CHALLENGE: How do they celebrate Easter in Sweden? Use a map to locate Sweden and then write a fact file about Easter in Sweden. They do something quite interesting which you could do too just as soon as you find out what it is. Send us a photo of your findings.
