## Maths

- ❖ Solve the 'Under the Sea' multistep word problems involving adding, subtracting, and dividing. Choose either Shrimp 1\*, Tiger Shark 2\*\* or Blue Whale 3\*\*\* difficulty rating.
- ❖ Use your addition and subtraction skills to crack the codes and discover the names of the hidden 'Under the Sea' creatures.
- ❖ Look at the data in the 'Oceans of the World' Fact Table and answer the questions about the areas and average depths of the world's oceans. Ask a grown up to check your answers afterwards.

## Creative

- ❖ Create an 'Under the Sea' creature using anything you have to hand at home - toilet rolls, scraps of paper, magazines, strips of material, empty packaging. Have a look at the examples of 'Toilet Roll Fish' on the resources sheet.
- ❖ Create an 'Under the Sea' theme scene in a shoebox or similar-sized box. Include the sea creatures, the coral, the seaweed and even some hidden treasure. Have a look at the examples of 'shoebox scenes' on the resources sheet.
- ❖ Imagine you are your favourite sea creatures. Write and perform a song describing what your life is like in the ocean. Take inspiration from the Disney song 'Under the Sea'.

## Investigative

- ❖ The seas and oceans around the world are increasingly polluted by plastics. Research why plastics in our oceans is a problem, including watching the Newsround video through this link, <https://www.bbc.co.uk/newsround/42810179> and make a poster explaining the problem and how people could make things better.
- ❖ Did you know that objects, including animals, float more easily in the sea and oceans than in fresh water? Investigate this by conducting this 'Salt Water Experiment'.
- ❖ Find out the names of different parts of a sea animal of your choice (e.g., shark, dolphin, octopus). Draw a scientific diagram of the animal, labelling the body parts, and explain how the animal's body is well-suited and adapted to its 'Under the Sea' habitat.
