This week, Year 2 have been exploring their knowledge of subtracting. In English, we have been looking at the story of Little Red Riding Hood.

The children have had great fun orally retelling the story using puppets they have made.



Year 3 have completed our work on Claude in English and have now started a new topic. We will be creating an information text about cars of the past and cars of the future that we will share with you as parents and carers. So far we've discovered some amazing facts. This week in Year 6 we have moved onto a new unit looking at the devastating volcanic eruption of Mount Vesuvius on the city of Pompeii.
