During this live event, we heard from young people, from all over the world, who have been displaced due to conflict or persecution. We listened to their stories of resilience and how they have overcome adversities which links to the overall theme of Refugee Week 2024: Our Home.

In classes, we have discussed what home means to each of us from a place of refuge, a feeling or a state of mind. We have discussed how it can be found in smells, tastes or sounds; from the clothes we wear to the words we grow up with; in food, music and arts; in our cultures and in our landscapes. Home can be in more than one place and finding it can be a journey, as it has been for many people in our community. We talked about the simple everyday acts in which we can stand in solidarity with refugees and make new connections in our communities.

Here at Hearsall, we are incredibly proud to celebrate our diversity and understand that taking part in events like this assembly allows for our families to feel represented.
